This was Picasso's first notable body of work, known as his Blue Period. It is a series of paintings where shades of blue dominate every piece and the mood that pervades these works is one of profound melancholy.

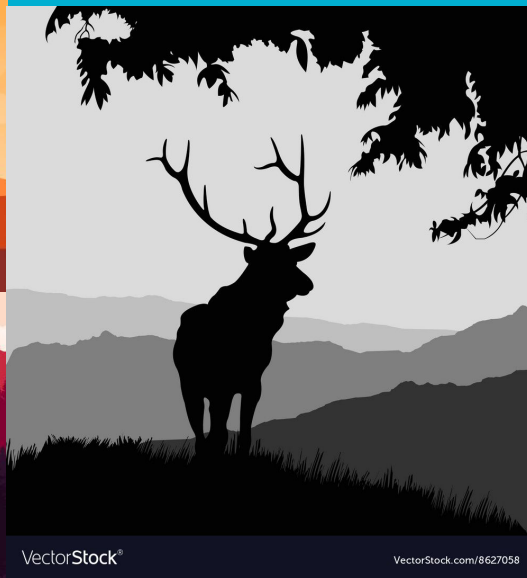


## Painting Sections

Foreground- Part of a view nearest to the observer, (darker more detail, shades).

The middleground is the space naturally occurring between the foreground and the background (True hue)

Background-Part of the view furthest from the observer (lighter less detail, tints).
